<p>Boston Big Local Legacy and Music Event</p>	<p>Boston Big Local Legacy and Music Event is a two day music and arts festival to take place on 27th/28th July. The event is designed to appeal to the family audience from the Boston area but also to draw in visitors to the area from the wider South Lincolnshire hinterland. The festival is to be free at point of access with funding from BTAC, National Lottery Awards for All, UKSPF, NPO and a 'Pay What You Decide' scheme where the public are asked to donate on departing the festival with the funding going into the programme for the following year. Public consultation (both in person, with young people and on-line) will take place to inform the programme and to support the bid to the National Lottery.
