## **ANNEX 1**

### **(a) MANDATORY CONDITIONS**

#### **Conditions set out in The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) Order 2010**

1. (1) The responsible person shall take all reasonable steps to ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
- (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises in a manner which carries a significant risk of leading or contributing to crime and disorder, prejudice to public safety, public nuisance, or harm to children—
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to—
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic (other than any promotion or discount available to an individual in respect of alcohol for consumption at a table meal, as defined in section 159 of the Act);
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less;
  - (d) provision of free or discounted alcohol in relation to the viewing on the premises of a sporting event, where that provision is dependent on—
    - (i) the outcome of a race, competition or other event or process, or
    - (ii) the likelihood of anything occurring or not occurring;
  - (e) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

2. The responsible person shall ensure that no alcohol is dispensed directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).
3. The responsible person shall ensure that free tap water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.

**From 01<sup>st</sup> October 2010 the following conditions will apply**

4. (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder shall ensure that an age verification policy applies to the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.  
(2) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and a holographic mark.
5. The responsible person shall ensure that—
  - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures—
    - (i) beer or cider: ½ pint;
    - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
    - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
  - (b) customers are made aware of the availability of these measures.

**(b) EMBEDDED RESTRICTIONS**

1. Credit sales
  - (i) Alcohol shall not be sold or supplied unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is sold or supplied, except alcohol sold or supplied with and for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time, consumed with the meal and paid for together with the meal.

**ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE CLUB OPERATING SCHEDULE**

**a) General**

**b) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder**

1. Proof of Age scheme

There shall be in place for the premises a written policy to prevent the sale or supply of alcohol to persons under 18 years of age. That policy shall require any person who appears to be under the age of 18 years to produce one of the following forms of identification:

- photo driving licence
- passport
- Citizen card supported by the Home Office
- Official ID card issued by HM Forces or European Union bearing a photograph and birth of the holder



## **c) Public Safety**

### 1. First aid

- (i) A responsible person shall ensure that appropriate first aid equipment and materials are kept in an appropriate place or places on the premises and shall be responsible for ensuring that any materials used are replaced within a reasonable time.

### 2. Third Party Inspections

- (i) Appropriately qualified contractors shall be appointed to carry out inspections of :

- (a) electrical systems
- (b) any emergency lighting systems
- (c) fire fighting equipment
- (d) fire safety lights
- (e) central heating equipment

of a frequency which each such qualified contractor shall elect. On completion of each such inspection a written report will be obtained and will be held for a minimum of 6 yrs. Any work required by virtue of the inspection to return the property to the appropriate standard shall be undertaken within the timescale established in the report.

### 3. Standard lighting and emergency lighting

- (i) A responsible person will make periodic checks to ensure that all parts of the premises accessed by the public are sufficiently illuminated whether by natural or artificial light or a mixture of both.
- (ii) A responsible person will periodically ensure that the batteries serving any emergency lighting are properly charged and have sufficient capacity to allow emergency evacuation.

### 4. Electrical Appliances and Electricity supply

- (i) A responsible person shall make visual checks to ensure that:
  - (a) the cables of and electrical appliances are in good and safe condition prior to use.
  - (b) the cables of and electrical appliances brought onto the premises by visiting performing artists are in good and safe condition prior to use.

### 5. Special effects

- (i) In the event that any special effect shall be required on the premises then it shall be performed only by a competent and appropriately trained person. At the same time advice as to all necessary steps to be taken to minimise risk to safety of the audience and of staff. No special effect shall be made or given by any member of staff upon the licensed premises.

### 6. Emergency evacuation procedures

- (i) A responsible person and where necessary other staff shall always be required to familiarise themselves with emergency egress routes and shall receive appropriate instruction to enable them to assist in the evacuation of the premises should an emergency require it.

## **d) The Prevention of Public Nuisance**

### 1. Noise

- (i) Steps must be taken to ensure noise does not emanate from the premises from either music or the departure of users of the premises.

## **e) The Protection of Children from Harm**

### 1. Child restrictions

(i) Children will only be allowed into designated areas and will be supervised by an adult at all times.
