

In relation to this application, the following Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003 has been considered –

From Section 9.12 –Each responsible authority will be an expert in their own field...for example the police have a key role in managing the night-time economy.....However, any responsible authority under the 2003 Act may make representations with regard to any of the licensing objectives if they have evidence to support such representations. Licensing Authorities must therefore consider all relevant representations from responsible authorities carefully, even where the reason for a particular responsible authority's interest or expertise in the promotion of a particular objective may not be immediately apparent.

This application is for a premises licence to enable the applicant to supply alcohol on and off sales, 7 days a week between the hours of 1100 hours and 2300 hours with the operating style being that of a take away and restaurant. With the opening hours being from 1100 hours to 1100 hours 7 days a week. This is believed to be a mistake and has been confirmed by the applicant. The intended opening hours are 1100 hours to 2300 hours. Late night refreshment has not been applied for.

The applicant did not approach Lincolnshire Police Licensing Department prior to the application being submitted. Had they done so they would have been advised to email a draft copy of the application so that a consultation could commence.

The conditions offered in the application, although well intentioned, are inadequate and do not address the risk posed and therefore do not fully promote the licensing objectives.

The applicant has failed to address off sales of alcohol and the current Public Space Protection Order (PSPO) in relation to alcohol which is in place in Boston. They have not offered any conditions to show how they will manage off sales so as not to assist in crime and add to the street drinking issues of Boston. As the plan shows the outside dining area of the premises this will be licensed under 'on sales' and Lincolnshire Police suggest that off sale be removed from the application. This has been posed to the applicant and Ms Cagdas had no objection to this.

Lincolnshire Police has concerns that Cavit Cagdas, the applicants father is behind the business that will operate with the benefit of this premises licence (if granted). Mr Cagdas was the premises licence holder of 12 Red Lion Street, Boston when smuggled cigarettes and alcohol were

found in his shop in 2010 and 2011, the premises licence was reviewed and subsequently revoked.

Since this time 12 Red Lion Street had become licensed again, Mr Cagdas has not been the premises licence holder during this time however he has presented as owner and Companies House shows him as director of Metsor Ltd with a registered address of 12 Red Lion Street, its description being that of retail sale in non-specialised stores with food, beverages or tobacco predominating, between July 2014 and December 2018 when the company was dissolved. This suggests he has been operating a business which benefits from a premises licence which Lincolnshire Police would have objected to had he applied to transfer it. It also shows that the premises licence holders at the time were not fulfilling the requirement of the Licensing Act 2003 by being the person carrying on the business. Mr Cagdas is no longer associated with 12 Red Lion Street.

To be a premises licence holder the applicant need to be carrying on or proposing to carry on a business which involves the use of the premises for licensable activities. Companies House showed that Mr Cagdas was the sole director of Cagdas Boston Ltd from December 2018 until 5th July 2019. The company has a registered address of 4 & 6 New Street, Boston and is described as unlicensed restaurant and cafes and take-away food shops and mobile foods stands.

Lincolnshire Police has had email conversations with the applicant about Mr Cagdas and his involvement with the premises. Initially the applicant confirmed that she was carrying on the business however she also confirmed that her father's role was that of sole director of the business. Since this time Mr Cagdas has now been removed as director and the applicant is now the sole director. Of concern was that following this Mr Cagdas was still shown as having 75% or more ownership of shares. Companies House was then notified on 24th July that on 17th July Mr Cagdas ceased control and this changed to the applicant having significant influence or control, but not any listing with regards to percentage of ownership as before with her father.

Lincolnshire Police are concerned that Mr Cagdas is behind this business that will benefit from a premise licence if granted. There was evidence to this fact when the application was submitted and subsequent changes have been made to remove Mr Cagdas as and when issues have been highlighted by the Police. Lincolnshire Police are concerned that should Mr Cagdas be behind the business then the crime and disorder licensing objective will be undermined due to his previous history. Lincolnshire Police are concerned that the applicant is not solely independent of her father in regards to this business and the quick changes to Companies House during the application process, as points of issue have been pointed out by Lincolnshire Police suggests this. Please see the email thread discussing the business ownership between the applicant and Pc McConville at appendix A and the information filed on Companies House for Cagdas Boston Ltd and person of control at appendix B

If the committee are satisfied with the account the applicant will give to explain the recent changes to Companies House and except that the applicant is responsible for the business and therefore feel that granting the premises licence is appropriate then Lincolnshire Police recommend that to ensure that Mr Cagdas has nothing to do with the business that operates from this premises licence in the future, and to gain assurance from the applicant that her father has

nothing to do with the business so as to promote the crime and disorder licensing objective
Lincolnshire Police recommend that a condition is added to the premise licence to state this fact.

Cavit CAGDAS will have no involvement what so ever with the business that operates under this premises licence.

This will mean that if changes are made to Companies House in regards to Cagdas Boston Ltd or indeed another business is incorporated at this premises operating benefiting from this premises licence (if granted) then regardless of a change in premises licence paperwork, Mr Cagdas will not be able to be involved in the business. If he is found to be involved through subsequent enquiries in regards to this application or other future enquiries then Lincolnshire Police will be able to review the premises licence and prosecute the premise licence holder.

If possible, please suggest alterations to the application that would resolve the problem mentioned above, again paying attention to the **Licensing Objectives:**

Should the committee grant the premises licence then Lincolnshire Police suggest the following conditions replace the wording in section 18 of the application so that the premise licence has robust conditions which fully assist the premise licence holder in promoting the licensing objectives.

Lincolnshire Police recommend that alcohol supply ceases at 2230 hours daily as opposed to 2300 hours applied for. As the premises will close at 2300hrs and it doesn't not allow off sales so persons will be unable to take alcohol with them. This will assist the premises in reducing crime and disorder as enough time will be given for customers to drink up and so customers will not be become disgruntled when asked to drink up when they have just purchased a drink so that closing times are adhered to. It will lessen the likely hood of a breach in licensing/opening hours and reduce the risk of a beach in off sales which could contribute to street drinking and would put the individual is breach of the PSPO.

Steps Taken To Promote the Licensing Objectives

a) General

The primary operation of the premises shall be whereby the sale of alcohol is ancillary to the sale of food and hot beverages.

The theme of the venue will be one of a restaurant with a take away facility that predominantly provides seating for all eat-in customers.

The sale of alcohol shall be restricted to those persons purchasing a substantial meal for consumption on the premises.

The supply of alcohol shall primarily be by way of table service.

The licensed outside dining area will be clearly marked by fencing/barriers so as to contain customers so they can only arrive and leave through points agreed with Lincolnshire Police and these point will be covered by the premises CCTV system.

The outdoor area shall close at 22:00, with last alcohol orders for outside taken no later than 21:30.

At 22:00 all outdoor furniture will be removed and stored.

Drinks served outside will be in polycarbonate glasses and all bottled drinks for the outdoor seating will be decanted into polycarbonate before leaving the bar/serving area. This outside seating area will be cleared of tableware immediately after each sitting.

No open drinking vessels will be allowed to be taken outside of the premises, save for drinks to be consumed in the outside seating area by those seated at the tables provided; this will be closely monitored and controlled by staff.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Cavit CAGDAS will have no involvement what so ever with the business that operates under this premises licence.

A CCTV system shall be installed, recording and maintained in working order and operated at the premises to the satisfaction of Lincolnshire Police, specifically:

a) For outside areas there shall be a minimum of two high resolution colour cameras, fitted in a weatherproof housing. One for external coverage of the premises entrance and one for coverage of the external dining area and its entrance/exit.

b) There shall be a minimum of one high-resolution colour camera fitted to each public entrance/exit. To provide a quality head and shoulder image for facial recognition/identification purposes of all persons entering the premises.

c) There shall be sufficient cameras able to cope with the normal operating illumination to reasonably cover all licensed public areas.

d) Recordings must be kept for a minimum of 31 days and endorsed with the accurate, correct time/date (BST/GMT adjusted).

e) Police and/or Authorised Licensing Officers shall be able on attendance to view immediate playback of any incident without the necessity for download.

f) Recordings of incidents at the premises must be provided to the police following lawful request.

g) A member of management shall be on the premises at all times they are open to the public who is capable of operating the CCTV system and providing recordings on request. When this is not possible recordings shall be provided within 24 hours of the original request.

h) Recording equipment shall be housed in a secure room/cabinet where access and operation is strictly limited to authorised persons.

i) In the event of a system malfunction, the Designated Premises Supervisor or the Premises Licence Holder must immediately notify Lincolnshire Police Licensing Department tel 01522 558448 or email countylicensinggroup@lincs.pnnpolice.uk. Details of this malfunction must be recorded in the premises refusals/incident book. Arrangements for its repair must be made without delay. The Licensing Authority and Police Licensing must be notified when the system is again operational.

c) Public safety

An incident/refusals book shall be kept at the premises, in which details of crime and/or disorder relating to the premises shall be recorded. The incident/refusals book shall contain the following details;

* Time, date and location of incident/refusals.

* Nature of the incident/refusal.

* Names, addresses and contact details of persons involved.

* Result of the incident/refusals.

* Action taken to prevent such incidents.

* Each entry signed by the DPS or other responsible person employed at the premises and so authorised by the DPS; and

* Retained for a period of no less than 12 months and made available to Lincolnshire Police for inspection upon request.

Many thanks for your email. The issue is that Cavit is the sole director and therefore the person in charge of the business - companies house says 75% or more responsibility. The person in this position should be the premises licence holder, not yourself as you are not director. Hence my question about being responsible for the business. In the past Cavit has had a premises licence revoked (from memory for smuggled goods) and Lincolnshire Police would object to him having one again. If you were the sole director and the premises licence was in the company name or your name we would have no issue but if your father holds any position of responsibility whether on companies house or on the premises licence then Lincolnshire Police have issue as we have evidence of past criminality and will have to make representation to this.

Not really, the named contact on a utilities account does not have to be the director, and as far as I can see there is no Tates Fish & Chip Shop Ltd registered on companies house. If there was and you were director then there would be less concern but the only company registered at the address you want a premises licence for is the one your dad is director of. You've already proved that your involved with the address, but I need evidence you are responsible for the business, for example registered director on companies house and not your dad, as companies house currently says otherwise. If your dad owns the building or leases the building and rents it/sub leases it to you (therefore his business is that of rental) it wouldn't say on companies house that the nature of his business is unlicensed restaurants and cafes and takeaway food shops and mobile food stands.

You really need to be honest with me, as I've said in a previous email is an offence under Sec 158 licensing Act to make a false statement in connection with the application.

You need to be the responsible person (director) so that if taxes are paid incorrectly or people are employed illegally it falls with you, where as things stand at the moment it falls with your father as immigration and HMRC look to see who the director is, and you already confirmed in a previous email that your dad is the sole director.
